A firm proposal on a Business Stability Initiative must be developed and implemented as a matter of urgency.	
10.	It is agreed that a major KZN Investment Conference will be held in April 2019 to promote investments into KwaZulu-Natal catalytic projects, focussing specifically on the identified lead sectors.
